

LCAA INSTRUCTOR PILOT APPLICATION

LCAA Instructor Pilots provide flight instruction to Club Members, demonstrate safe operation of model aircraft, and act as ambassadors for LCAA and for RC aviation generally. Qualifying as an LCAA Instructor Pilot requires the recommendation of two existing instructors and approval of the Board. LCAA Instructor Pilots should be able to:

- _____ 1. Demonstrate knowledge of the AMA safety code, the Club field rules, the LCAA Pilot Qualification Program, and the requirements for achieving LCAA Qualified Pilot status.
- _____ 2. Perform a comprehensive pre-flight check of a new or rebuilt aircraft.
- _____ 3. Demonstrate instructor-level flying proficiency; trim a grossly out-of-trim aircraft in flight; safely recover an aircraft from an unusual attitude; and perform a controlled dead-stick landing.
- _____ 4. Teach Student Pilots all aspects of flight safety and field etiquette, including the AMA safety code and Club field rules.
- _____ 5. Give verbal instructions to Student Pilots before, during, and after flight in a clear, calm, and easily understood manner and encourage Student Pilots to develop their skills.
- _____ 6. Be accessible and willing to invest sufficient time to assist a reasonable number of Club Members in learning to fly radio-controlled aircraft.
